
Our Mission

Where does the money come from?

We receive no local or national government or diocesan support. Our parish relies upon the generous financial support from those who regularly attend church, and around 66% of our income comes through regular planned giving.

Our Annual Financial Target for 2018, then 2019

To maintain our existing ministry expenditure, we do require an increase in income of €17,000 this year.

For 2019 and following years, our mission vision includes someone to work specifically with the youth and children which will require a further €25,000 per annum. So total additional income for 2019 will be €42,000 - equivalent to additional €3500 per month.

How could this be achieved?

At present there are **36** households giving regularly to the church. It is worth noting that there are 81 on the Church Members Electoral Roll. This does not include all regular attendees.

If we could increase the regular givers to **50** in 2018 and **65** by the end of 2019 and they were all able to contribute an additional... for example:

3€ p/w (the cost of a coffee) = an increase in €7,800

5€ p/w (a pint of beer & packet of crisps) = an increase in €13,000

8€ p/w (a bottle of wine or weekly paper bill) = an increase in €20,800

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Does St. Peter's receive funding from the Anglican Church?

A: No. Like every other Anglican Chaplaincy in France, we receive no financial support from the Church of England or any other external body. All costs for mission, ministries, clergy, staff, the maintenance of our premises – everything is funded by the giving of the individual members.

Q: How should I give?

A: Gifts by standing order (virement) or cheque are the Church's preferred ways of receiving your giving. This enables us to manage our budgeting process.

Q: How will my giving affect my taxes?

A: If you pay French income tax you can claim back 66% of your giving. A taxpayer in France who donates €200 to St Peter's Church is entitled to a tax reduction of €132. The system is straightforward – at the end of the tax year the Church office/Treasurer will provide you with a certificate stating how much you gave in the previous year. Unfortunately, owing to French Legislation tax certificates cannot be given for gifts made in cash or for any gifts made to St. Peter's Charitable Giving Association.

Q: Who knows how much I give?

A: Your giving is a private matter. All details of individual giving are held in confidence by the Treasurer. None of the Church Council officers are privy to any details of individual giving.

Your Response

While we prefer regular giving one off gifts are very welcome.
